Korean-American Contemporary Artist and Director of Fine Arts and Graduate Studies at Long Island University

Seung Lee is a Korean-American contemporary artist. He is currently Director of Fine Arts and Graduate Studies as well as Professor at Long Island University, Post Campus. He received a BFA in Drawing from Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, Maryland and an MFA in Painting from Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, New York.

His paintings, drawings, and large-scale installations have been exhibited extensively in the US as well as internationally: China, Italy, France, Japan, and Korea. He has received numerous reviews in the New York Times, Newsday, Kyoto Times, Korea Daily News, Art Word Magazine, Art in Culture Magazine, Art Price Magazine, and Art and People Magazine. He has been featured in "Artist Profiles of Korea and Japan" several times.

In the Spring of 2007, Seung Lee was chosen as featured artist for "NY Artist Series" which was part of the National Art Educators Association Conference in NYC. In 2011, Seung Lee was awarded "Best International Korean Artist" from the Korean Art Association in Korea.
